The purpose of the programme

The aim of the programme is to provide aspiring musical artists with the essential skills for a sustainable career in the performance of different genres of music. Through musical exploration and reflective practice, they will build resilience, adaptability and broaden their musicianship, and be able to prepare for employment opportunities in the live performance industry.

Graduates of this Programme will be able to:

- Apply a range of technical skills to inform music across a range of genres and contexts
- Apply performance techniques to engage an audience

- Manage personal wellbeing and professional practice to identify and pursue employment opportunities in music performance contexts
- Analyse musical context to inform own creative practice as a performing musician

COURSES

4.0

MUSICIAN'S TOOLKIT

This course is an intensive 4-week course designed to ignite your passion for music while building a solid foundation in essential skills for creative work in music.

4.1

GENRE EXPLORATION I

This 4-week course builds on the foundational skills developed in 4.0, focusing on a dive into a specific musical genre. Students will explore the technical, creative, and cultural aspects of a chosen genre, developing proficiency in relevant technologies and creative processes. The course emphasises practical application, creative problem-solving, and critical reflection.

4.2

GENRE EXPLORATION II

This 4-week course builds on the foundational skills developed in 4.1, expanding students' experience through the exploration of a second specified genre. Participants will delve into the technical, creative, and cultural dimensions of their chosen genre, fostering proficiency in the relevant technologies and creative processes. The course emphasises practical application, innovative problem-solving, and critical reflection, encouraging students to engage deeply with the unique characteristics and influences of the genre.

5.01

GENRE EXPLORATION III

This 4-week course builds upon the skills acquired in 4.2, focusing on the exploration of a third (and final) specified genre. Students will investigate the technical, creative, and cultural elements of this genre, enhancing their proficiency in associated technologies and creative methodologies. The course prioritises practical application, inventive problem-solving, and critical analysis, encouraging students to examine the distinctive features and contextual significance of the genre, thereby enriching their overall musical understanding and versatility.

5.0

SUSTAINABLE MUSICIANSHIP

This intensive 4-week course develops students' skills in personal wellbeing and professional practice within the music industry. By exploring a second instrument, students will expand their musicianship and deepen their understanding of ensemble playing, arranging, and composition. Musical exploration and reflective practice will foster resilience, adaptability, and essential career skills.

5.1

ADVANCED GENRE STUDY 1

This 4-week course explores the relationship between performance, production, and research through immersion in an advanced musical genre. Students will investigate its stylistic, technical, and cultural dimensions, developing proficiency in relevant technologies and performance methods. Emphasising practical application and critical analysis, the course deepens understanding of the genre's distinctive features and context. Students

The course also introduces real-world industry roles and expectations. Students will learn to prepare for employment by producing contracts, invoices, and professional materials.

5.2

ADVANCED GENRE STUDY 2

This 4-week course develops cohesion between performance, production, and research through immersion in a second advanced musical genre. Students will explore its stylistic, technical, and cultural dimensions, building proficiency in relevant technologies and performance methods. Emphasising practical application and critical analysis, the course deepens genre understanding and context. Students will apply these insights in performance to enhance audience engagement and creative versatility.

5.3

ADVANCED GENRE STUDY 3

This 4-week course integrates performance, production, and research through immersion in a third and final advanced musical genre. Students will examine its stylistic, technical, and cultural dimensions, enhancing their skills in relevant technologies and performance practices. With a focus on practical application and critical analysis, the course deepens contextual understanding and genre fluency. Students will apply these insights in performance to engage audiences and expand their creative versatility.

PROGRAMME SPECIFIC INFORMATION

Courses are run as block courses with attendance required on Tuesdays – Thursday.

All courses are assessed by competency assessment, performance practical and music technology project, and analysis assessments

There will be a performance open to the community at the end of the programme, and the possibility of a tour around Auckland High Schools.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry Criteria for this programme is:

- Students will be 16 years or age or older
- Domestic student
- The Certificate in Music (Creativity) Level 4 or NCEA Level 2 or equivalent
- All will be required to attend an interview/audition. Some musical proficiency is required (pitch, time).
- Where English is not the first language IELTS General of Academic score of 5.5 with no band score lower than 5 or equivalent

PATHWAYS AND FURTHER STUDY OPTIONS

This qualification is intended to provide a pathway to employment or self-employment as a performer in the performing arts industry role.
